43 Temporary Cardiac Transvenous Pacing may be contraindicated in a patient with an active DNACPR; however the ultimate responsibility for the clinical decision to implant/withdraw temporary pacing remains with the senior clinician responsible for their care at the immediate time of the event

cardiac output has improved Demand (synchronous) mode is the preferred means of pacing as it paces only when the patient's heart rate falls below a level set by the clinician This mode avoids problems such as a pacer impulse landing on a T-wave and possibly causing a ventricular dysrhythmia Fixed (asynchronous) mode paces at the rate set by the

transcatheter pacing system that provides bipolar sensing and pacing in the right ventricle The device has an active fixation mechanism consisting of 4 electrically inactive tines designed to anchor it in the cardiac tissue at the implant location in the right ventricle

Programming confirmed with the Cardiac Health Provider (a written order in the chart is required) Patient should be properly monitored and connected to an external pacing/defibrillator during the procedure For ICDs, great care must be taken to ensure that the detections are turned back ON before the patient is unmonitored or leaving the facility
