Phlebotomy Safety for All Ages

- Blood from Children <12 months of age may be collected from the heel, with the 1 st choice being from the lateral surface (little toe side) followed by the medial plantar surface (big toe side)
- The great toe is not to be used
- The maximum depth of the incision is 20 mm
- Pre-warming at 42 degrees C increases flow x7

Laws Governing the Employment of Minors

3 Minors 16 and 17 years of age, if not attending school, may work full time throughout the year Factory work is permitted for minors 16 years of age or older (See "Prohibited Occupations" on page 10) EXCEPTIONS 1 Minors 12 years of age or older may be employed in the hand harvest of berries, fruits and vegetables 2

2018 The Weight of Our Children - New Mexico Department ...

In New Mexico, 256% of children under age 18 are food insecure, compared to 175% nationally, and 697% of New Mexican students receive free or reduced lunch at school Additionally, many New Mexican schools struggle to provide adequate physical education (PE); just 257% of New Mexican students attend daily PE classes

Epidemiology of Suicide in Children and Adolescents •15 to 25% of adolescents endorse some degree of suicidal ideation •2-6% specific and active

ideation • 3rd leading cause of death among youth and young adults • 13% of mortality in this age group in 2005 • The suicide rate in this age group increased by 8% from 2003 to 2004
