Competency-based education (CBE) is one approach that NPD educators use to assess and vali-date competence CBE reflects a pragmatic concern that nurses are able to do a task, rather than simply know how to do a task Competency models began to evolve during the 1960s as an approach to education, and today CBE models constitute a widely applied

Guidelines for Approval of a Nurse Aide Training Program

all nurse aide training programs offered by facility based and non-facility based sites be approved by the State Sections 1819(e) and 1919(e) of OBRA directs states to specify the training and competency evaluation programs that they have approved to prepare nurse aides for employment in RHCs on or after January 1, 1990
