CARE OF THE NEWBORN: THERMOREGULATION A newborn is at a particular disadvantage in maintaining a “normal” body temperature With the neonate’s large body surface and lean subcutaneous fat, the newborn loses about four times as much heat as the adult Poor thermal stability is greatly due to the excessive heat loss rather than heat
