Nursing Care Plan Known to be the "blueprint" of the nursing process Used to identify the scope and depth of the nursing practice Evidenced by: mjmanalangquintorn Sufficient data collection At least one goal stated per nursing diagnosis Outcome criteria identified for each goal Nursing interventions related to the nursing diagnosis
