### **Grade Point Average and Class Rank - Education Opens Doors**

On your report card, you will typically see two types of GPAs: semester and cumulative. A semester GPA calculates your grade point average from that semester only. Your cumulative GPA calculates your grade point average from the very beginning of your freshman year. You will have a separate high school
