1878 The Women's Suffrage Amendment is first introduced to congress 1890 The National Women Suffrage Association and the American Women Suffrage Association merge to form the National American Woman Suffrage Association (NAWSA) As the movement's mainstream organization, NAWSA wages state-by-state campaigns to obtain voting rights for women
