Bacterial Soft Rot. In some years this can be a major problem that can almost wipe out a planting if allowed to spread without remedial action. The pathogen is *Erwinia carotovora* (yes, it affects carrots) and affects all the bearded irises. It presents as a soft, foul-smelling rhizome rot followed by wilting and dying of the leaf fans.

The flowers remain open throughout the night and into the morning, when temperatures rise and the flowers wilt. Like daylilies, four o'clock flowers bloom just a single time, then wilt and eventually fall off the plant.. On cloudy days, the flowers open earlier and sometimes won't close at all.

If you are low on free space, try growing grapes on a stake. Pound in a sturdy stake next to the grape vine and securely attach it. Keep the vine growing vertically. Let the vine grow to the top of the stake the first year then top it. Allow 4 to 5 side canes to grow. Remove all the rest.

Gardeners using stakes usually snap off these side shoots. They typically get earlier and larger tomatoes but overall production tends to be less.
